I. Introduction

- A. Law enforcement is one of a few professions where you are trained and allowed to take the life of another human being. The most important factor to consider when discussing this issue is to know when you are justified in deploying deadly force. A law enforcement officer, just as a citizen, is subject to legal and civil ramifications if the use of deadly force was used inappropriately. In this block of training we will discuss when the use of deadly force is justified and, more importantly, when it is not.

II. Definitions

- A. **Deadly Force:** Force likely to cause serious physical injury or death.
- B. **Less Lethal Force:** Force which may result in death or serious bodily injury. The probability of which is greatly reduced over that of normal ammunition.
- C. **Non-Deadly Force:** Force which is not intended to cause death or serious bodily injury.
- D. **Reasonably Necessary:** An action or response, which is reasonable, given the circumstances present at the time and which is necessary to accomplish a lawful objective.
- E. **Serious Physical Injury:** An injury which creates a substantial risk of death, disfigurement, prolonged hospitalization, impairment of the functions of any bodily organ or limb, or any injury that medical personnel deem to be potentially life threatening.

- F. **Excessive Force:** Any force which is not reasonably necessary.
- G. **Imminent Jeopardy:** When a subject has the intent, ability, means, and opportunity to inflict serious bodily injury or death.
- H. **Preclusion:** All other efforts will or have failed.
- I. **Institutional Integrity:** The condition whereby order is maintained in a detention facility to prevent violations of law, threatened assaults to others, attempted/threatened suicide, or failure of prisoners to respond to lawful commands to do any acts which are necessary for safety concerns of the facility.

III. *Case Law*

- A. Johnson v. Glick
 - 1. Established four points in determining whether Constitutional line has been crossed when utilizing deadly force.
 - a. Was there a need for the force?
 - b. The relationship between the need and the amount of force.
 - c. The extent of the injuries inflicted.
 - d. Whether the force was applied in good faith, or maliciously and sadistically for the very purpose of causing harm.

Wheelchair example

1973 – U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit: Johnson into House of Detention. Failed to follow directions. Officer Fuller went into cell and struck Johnson. Put Johnson in holding cell for two hours. Johnson was refused medical treatment for two hours. Johnson suffering from terrible pains in the head since.
RULING: Need for intentional force in correctional setting. Must use four- point test when reviewing.

2. Where the suspect poses not threat to the officer and no threat to others, the harm resulting from failing to apprehend does not justify to the use of deadly force to do so.
3. A police officer may not seize an unarmed, non-dangerous suspect by shooting him dead.
4. Police officers may use deadly force to apprehend a fleeing felon if he/she has probable cause to believe that the suspect poses a threat or serious physical injury or death, either to the officer or to others.
5. An officer must give a verbal warning when practical or feasible.

IV. General Orders

- A. Deadly force shall not be used unless it is reasonably necessary.
- B. Deadly force may be used to apprehend fleeing felons.
 1. All other means of arrest have been exhausted.
 2. Officer believes that the escape of the felon poses an imminent threat of death or serious physical injury to an officer(s) or other person(s).
- C. Deadly force cannot be used to apprehend a fleeing misdemeanor.

B. Verbal Commands

1. An officer should establish a command presence by the use of firm, professional commands.
2. The commands should be simple, easy to understand and repeated as necessary.
3. Verbal commands should be issued by *one officer* to avoid confusion.
4. If you notice that the primary officer is not issuing effective commands or has forgotten certain commands, tell that officer that they forgot a command or that you are going to give a command.

C. Empty Hand Control

1. Officers need to verbalize commands to a subject while attempting any empty hand control. You need to let the individual know what you want them to do.
2. Examples of empty hand control would be:
 - a. Escort Positions
 - b. Pressure Points

D. Artificial Incapacitators

1. These may be used in situations where empty hand controls have either proven to be ineffective or would not be prudent due to the subject's behavior.

3. Subjects under the influence of drugs have an increased level of pain tolerance depending on the amount and type of drug consumed.

F. Impact Weapons

1. Batons or other types of impact weapons can be used with varying degrees of intensity.
2. Batons may be used to strike the subject in designated target areas of the body such as:
 - a. Torso
 - b. Legs
 - c. Arms
3. Intentional strikes to the subject's head, kidneys or groin shall be avoided, whenever possible.
4. The baton may be used as a lever to induce sufficient pressure to cause the subject to cease aggressive action.
5. May be used to block strikes.
6. Types of Batons currently issued:
 - a. ASP Expandable Baton
 - b. Monadnock Expandable Baton
 - c. Monadnock Straight Baton

<p>3. Intent</p> <p>a. The officer will have to show that the assailant not only had the ability and opportunity, but also demonstrated the intent to carry out the act.</p> <p>4. Means</p> <p>a. The officer must show that the assailant had possession of a weapon or some other means to inflict death or serious bodily injury.</p> <p>D. E. Other factors that will be taken into consideration are:

1. Timeliness

a. The officer must act to control the aggressive act in a timely manner. Force must not be used too early or too late relative to the subject's actions.

b. Timeliness is defined as "not too early or too late to prevent physical injury, or to complete the legally authorized task".

c. Factors that an officer must consider are:

1. Distance
2. Shielding
3. Obstructions
4. Type of Attack or Resistance Encountered
5. Risk to others

Increased distance from subject allows more time to react.

If officer/civilians shielded from threat posed use of force can be delayed indefinitely.

<p>2. Officer's Perception</p> <p>a. The perceptions of the officer are also subject to judgement. Perceptions must be judged according to timeliness. The shorter the time period involved, the faster the events occur, and the less accurate the officer's probable total perception will be.</p> <p>b. Human perceptions are limited by scope, amount of information taken into account, and time. Mistakes in perception and resultant mistakes in action are not just probable, but they predictable.</p> <p>c. The officer should not be judge because he/she reacted from an improper perception when other responsible officers would have reacted in the same manner.</p> <p>d. An officer's actions must be judged on perceptions, not absolute facts. The courts must allow latitude for errors in perception.</p> <p>3. Totality of the Circumstances</p> <p>a. In reviewing the circumstances behind the use of force, the following factors must be taken into consideration:</p> <p>1. 82-1-6 is the adoption of state laws into county codes. VA code section 46.2-1313 allows this adoption. 82-1-6 lists the state codes which were adopted by the County. This class will deal with additional Fairfax County Codes.

II. Various County Codes

A. 82-1-21: Unlawful riding.

1. No person shall ride on any vehicle upon any portion thereof not designated or intended for the use of passengers. Except:

- a. Employees engaged in discharge of duty.
- b. Persons riding within truck body in space intended for merchandise.

NOTE: Sitting on tailgates or side of body of pickup trucks is not permitted.

B. 82-2-5: Other than official signs prohibited.

1. No person shall:

- a. Erect or maintain upon a highway any:
 - i. Warning sign
 - ii. Direction sign
 - iii. Marker sign
 - iv. Signal or light
 - v. Imitation of official sign, marker or signal light
- b. Erect or maintain any commercial advertising upon any:
 - i. Traffic sign
 - ii. Highway sign

- G. 82-6-21.2: Handlebars of motorcycles.
 - 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to register or to operate any motorcycle equipped with handlebars, or other type of steering mechanisms, that are more than 15 inches above the level of the seat of such motorcycle.
- H. 82-6-21.3: Mufflers on motorcycles.
 - 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or cause to be operated any motorcycle not equipped with a muffler or sound dissipative device in good working order and in constant operation.
 - 2. No person shall remove or render inoperative such device, except for repair, replacement or maintenance.
- I. 82-6-29: Tailgates on vehicles.
 - 1. Unlawful for the operator of any truck, trailer or other vehicle equipped with a tailgate to open or lower or permit such tailgate to be lowered or opened, except when being loaded or unloaded.

- X. 82-4-32: Backing of vehicles.
 1. The operator of any vehicle in the county shall not back such vehicle unless such movement can be made with safety and without interfering with other traffic.
- Y. 82-4-33: Blocking intersection.
 1. No operator of a vehicle shall enter:
 - a. intersection
 - b. marked crosswalk
 2. Unless there is sufficient space beyond such intersection or crosswalk in the direction in which such vehicle is proceeding to accommodate the vehicle without obstructing the passage of other vehicles or pedestrians, not withstanding any traffic control signal indication.
- Z. 82-6-38.1: Use of protective helmet while operating a bicycle.
 1. Any person under 15 years of age shall wear a protective helmet while riding or being carried on a bicycle on any highway, sidewalk or public bicycle path.

- B. Chain handcuffs' - tensile strength is 1200 psi
- C. Flex cuff - tensile strength is 300 psi

II. Purpose and limitations of restraints:

- A. Temporary restraint to prevent-
 - 1. Attack on officer or others
 - 2. Escape
 - 3. The destruction or concealment of evidence or contraband.
 - 4. Self inflicted injury.
 - 5. Medical reasons (by the direction of authorized medical personnel.)
 - 6. Property damage.

Why do we handcuff or restrain ?

*The officer may be directed to use restraints by the duty supervisor. Restraints should only be applied for the length of time absolutely necessary.

*Restraints are temporary and have limitations. People can get out of restraining devices. Don't trust your life on them.

(?) Shouldn't we search the prisoner before we cuff?

- At time of arrest you cuff then search.

- S.O. will search those prisoners who are already in custody prior to applying restraints.

III. When do you handcuff?

A. Police - discretion is authorized, it is recommended that all prisoners be handcuffed prior to transport.

B. Deputies- it is mandatory that all prisoners will be restrained prior to transport.

All personnel will be responsible for knowing the policies and procedures for their individual agencies

** In all cases where restraints are used, it is the responsibility of the transporting officer or deputy to check the restraints for proper fit and to insure that the restraints are double locked.**

C. The academy recommends that you establish your own system of always cuffing all prisoners who are under

You're direct control. This will help keep the safety of everyone in the forefront of every situation.

D. Where are the hands of the prisoner after you cuff? (Always in back!)

***exceptions** - pregnant females, obese persons, certain injuries, amputees. Other restraining devices may be involved during these exception situations.

E. Always double lock handcuffs and check restraints for proper fit.

IV. Handcuffs

A. Nomenclature:

1. Single strand
2. Double strand
3. Ratchet
4. Pawl
5. Spring
6. Keyhole
7. Hinge / Chain
8. Rivet
9. Double lock
10. Key with double lock actuator

Give students the blank nomenclature sheet and show the overhead.

B. Loading the handcuff's;

1. Push the single strand through the double strand until they are flush with each other or three to four teeth of the single strand show above the double strand.
2. Keep the handcuff's loaded while they are in the handcuff case. This allows the handcuff's to be in the proper set up position in the event that they need to be deployed to secure a prisoner.

Students will practice as the instruction is being given.

C. Gripping the handcuff's;

1. Handcuff's should be gripped in the strong hand.
2. Hold the handcuff's in center grasping the hinge or the chain of the cuff. (Key hole should be facing the palm when possible.)

3. The single strand will be facing forward.

***NOTE:** When the cuffs are being held, the cuff on the thumb side is known as the "inside" cuff and the cuff on the opposite side, little finger side is known as the "outside" cuff. The non-cuffing hand is the support side.

D. Applying the cuffs;

1. Target area where cuff is applied to subject is at the wrist. It is the area just below the hand and at the end of the inside or outside forearm. The cuff should be applied to the wrist with a push/pull method. It is to be done with only the amount of force necessary to allow the ratchet on the single strand of the cuff to go through the double strand completely and catch in the pawl. This is not a striking motion.

2. The support hand will maintain control of the subjects hand that is being cuffed. This will allow for the push of the single strand onto the wrist and the pull of the subject's hand, by the officers support hand, placing it into the cuff.

3. This will be repeated with the other hand. Once both cuffs are applied, they will be checked for proper fit. Checking for proper fit is done by placing the tip of your little finger below one of the strands at the outside or inside area of the wrist of the subject. Checking for proper fit insures the circulation is not disturbed.

4. The final step is to double lock the handcuffs'. This is done by depressing the double lock mechanism on each cuff using the actuator on the key (or similar object). Doing this helps prevent the subject from unlocking or removing the handcuffs as well as maintaining the proper fit of the handcuffs.

V. Special situations - Occasionally situations arise where traditional handcuffing cannot be utilized. In these cases you must adapt as best that you can.

1. Handcuffing two prisoners with one set of handcuffs. This is not recommended, however you may secure one wrist from each prisoner. Either a left wrist to a right wrist, a left wrist to a left wrist or vice versa.

Be sure you check your equipment at the start of each shift and after each use.

**** Handcuffing techniques will be taught. This is where the students will employ there skills, after demonstration by a instructor.****

You would still want to approach from a safe direction, with the subjects facing away from you. You safely but quickly secure both prisoners as best as you can. Still checking for proper fit and double lock.

2. Securing a prisoner with a flex-cuff. In cases where metal hand restraints are not an option, you may temporarily secure a prisoner with a nylon reenforced flex-cuff. Use caution when applying the flex cuff and checking for the proper fit. Once it is on it cannot be loosened. It must be cut off using wire cutters of some sort.

(T.O. 6.17.4)

3. If a subject is to large and or inflexible you may, in certain circumstances, use more then one set of hand restraints. When applying more than one set of handcuffs to one individual, extra precautions should be observed for safety. Be sure to check for proper fit on the wrist and double lock all cuffs.

4. You may also have a situation where the subject is very small. In these cases you may use one cuff to secure both wrists of the subject. You simply place the subjects wrist together (palm to palm or back of wrist to back of wrist).

VI. Handcuffing Techniques;

1. Speed cuffing / standing position

(T.O. 6.17- 1,2,3)

2. Speed cuffing / kneeling position

3. Handcuffing / prone position, rear approach

*** All of the above techniques will be explained to the students. Demonstrated by the instructors, and practiced by the students. Proper due regard for safety will always be observed when demonstrating and practicing these techniques. They will be done slowly at first to develop the technique. Speed will come later as the student becomes more proficient.**

* The officer will give verbal directions to the subject to place them in a proper and safe position for the officer and the subject. The below listed verbal commands are recommendations which reflect the actions requested by the officer of the subject. However, each situation is different and commands may vary depending on the dynamics of the situation. If the subjects hands are concealed then the officer will determine when they want the subject to display their hands.

**1. Speed cuffing / Standing -
(compliant subject)-verbal example:**

- A. You are under arrest.
- B. Slowly turn around and face away from my voice.
- C. Place your arms straight back behind you with your palms facing up.
- D. Spread your feet wide apart.
- E. Bend forward slightly at your waist.
- F. Turn your head to the (left/right/etc.)
- G. Do not move! Do you understand?

H. The officer will approach from position 2 ½ with their handcuffs in their hands and ready to be placed on the subject. The closer the officer gets to the subject, the more their hands will be up in front of them. Their handcuffs will be in the proper carry and loaded position. When the officer makes contact they will remain balanced and shuffle their feet if they need to move.

I. ** See attachment #1 for detailed description of the Speed-cuffing technique.**

Reminder - Once the handcuffs have been applied, checked for fit and double lock. The prisoners waist band area will be searched for weapons.

Seeing the subjects hands is an important part of officer safety. You may want to see them immediately, or you may want to wait until the subject has turned away from you.

Having them turn slowly may make you aware of concealed weapons.

Extending their arms behind them allows the officer to approach and handcuff effectively.

This technique will be demonstrated by the instructors and practiced by the students.

Attachment #1 gives both a written description and diagram of the speed cuffing technique.

2. Speed cuffing / Kneeling position -

The kneeling position may be utilized by the officer at their discretion. The higher the perceived threat of the subject, the higher their hands should go (away from the body) and the lower their body position should go (towards the ground). The verbal directions / commands are similar to those given for the standing cuffing position, to control the movement of the subject. Some additional commands are given to place the subject into the proper kneeling position. Example below:

- A. Police, don't move.
- B. You are under arrest.
- C. Put your hands up over your head, lock-out your elbows.
- D. Turn around, away from my voice.
- E. Keep your hands straight up and lower your self to one knee.
- F. Lower your other knee.
- G. Cross your feet at the ankles. (Optional)
- H. Spread your knees apart.
- I. Bring your arms straight back behind you, with your palms facing up.
- J. Bend forward slightly at your waist.
- K. Look to the (left/right/etc).
- L. Do not move! Do you understand ?
- M. The technique for speed cuffing in the kneeling position is the same as one for the standing position. The same approach will be used in both standing and kneeling handcuffing. **See attachment #1 for a detailed description of the Speed cuffing technique.**

Reminder - Once the handcuffs have been applied, checked for fit and double lock. The prisoners waist band area will be searched for weapons.

Having the subject keep their hands up during the time you are directing them into the kneeling position allows the subject to better maintain their balance. It also gives you a clear view of their hands and waist area.

Having the subject spread their knees makes it more difficult for them to move. Having the subject in a proper cuffing position allows the officer to make a safer approach.

3. Prone handcuffing - Rear approach

The tactics used for this technique are somewhat different than those used for standing and kneeling position handcuffing. What is similar is that the officer should still maintain a safe position when giving the verbal commands. There is a likelihood that in this situation there is a higher threat potential from the subject and a higher risk for the officer. With these considerations in mind, the officer should make every effort to utilize cover/concealment as much as possible. It may also be necessary for the officer to have their weapon out and on target. This would allow the officer to react effectively to a lethal force situation which may be presented by the subject. (I.E.- if they subject is suspected or know to have a weapon in their possession.)

(Verbal commands example-)

- A. Police don't move.
- B. Put your hands in the air, lock your elbows out.
- C. Turn around, away from my voice.
- D. Slowly lower yourself to your knees.
- E. Keeping your arms straight, slowly lower yourself to the ground, face down. Keep your arms out in front of you.
- F. Put your arms straight out to the sides, like an airplane. Palms facing up.
- G. Cross your feet at the ankles.
- H. Bring your heels to your butt.
- I. Spread your knees wide.
- J. Turn your head to the (left/right/etc.)
- K. Do not move! Do you understand?

The approach to the subject is different when using the prone-rear approach. First, you have an option of having the subject move closer to your position. This is done by directing the subject to walk slowly backwards after you have them put their hands up and face away from you. This would allow you to maintain your cover position. Second, once you have the subject in the prone position, you can

There is not a specific handcuffing technique to be utilized for this prone technique. However, it must be done as quickly as possible with balance control and safety in mind.

make your approach. In either situation you will approach with empty hands. Your first contact will be using push pressure on the subjects outside/top foot and place their heel against their butt. This can be done by using your hands or the shin area of your leg against the top area of their foot. Once you are in a control position, quickly pat search the waistband area of the subjects lower back. Take control of your handcuffs and tell the subject to give you one of their hands. Place the cuff on their wrist and tell them to give you the other hand then apply the second cuff. Securing both of the subjects hands behind their back. You may choose to check fit and double lock from this position or move to a safer location once the prisoner is secured and controlled.

It is recommended that contact be made with the subject with the assistance of a cover officer. Officer Safety should always be considered before making verbal or physical contact with a subject.

The search may be conducted from the prone position or the subject can be moved to a safer location. If the subject is to be moved, then assist them to their feet and escort them from a control position.

Reminder - Always check the handcuffs for proper fit, double lock and check for weapons.

If weapons are discovered, secure them as soon as you feel it is safe. The dynamics of each situation may dictate when this will be possible.

VII. Removing the handcuffs-

Removing the handcuffs from the prisoner will be done in a safe location and always from a position of control for the officer (subjects feet should be spread wide apart). From a control position (21/2 position behind the prisoner) the officer will remove the cuff that is farthest away first. They will direct the prisoner to place their uncuffed hand on their head. The officer will then step back, controlling the hand that is still cuffed, so that the prisoners arm is straight.

If the subject is know to have a weapon, do not have them remove it. If it is on the front part of their body then have them lay on the weapon.

Verbalize to the subject that you know they have a weapon. Tell them DO NOT make any movement toward that weapon.

The officer will direct the prisoner to place their second hand on top of their head once the second cuff has been removed. This will allow the officer to remove the second cuff safely.

This technique will be demonstrated by the instructors and practiced by the students.

*** All students must demonstrate the ability to effectively handcuff subjects from the standing, kneeling and prone positions. This must be done as it was instructed during class while maintaining control of their subjects, in a fluid motion (without stopping in the middle of the technique) and with due regard for safety.***



I. Handcuffs are a TEMPORARY restraining device and are NOT escape proof!

IV. In an arrest situation we should CUFF before we SEARCH.
"Cuff then Search" is a general rule that should be followed for officer safety reasons!

V. When do we handcuff?

The Academy recommends that you establish your own system of always handcuffing prisoners behind the back who are under your direct control !!!!!!

Sheriff's Office S.O.P. 510 dictates that it is mandatory that all prisoners be restrained prior to transport.

Police Department G.O. 203.3 states the following:

Prisoners should be handcuffed with their hands in the rear. When handcuffs are used, they shall be double locked. (This regulation does not require officers to handcuff all prisoners.) Injuries, handicaps, and age are among the considerations officers should use in determining whether or not to handcuff prisoners or use other restraining devices.

Anytime handcuffs are applied they should always be double locked after you check for proper fit. This will prevent the handcuffs from tightening on the subject's wrist, and makes them harder to pick!







I. Introduction

When a police officer encounters a person displaying symptoms of mental illness it is essential that these individuals be dealt with in adherence to established guidelines.

Fairfax County General Order 603.3 establishes procedural guidelines in this area and it will consist of the next two hours of lecture.

Definitions:

Mental Petition

Emergency Custody Order (ECO-4 hrs)

Temporary Detention Order (TDO -24hrs)

#1 Definition of mental petition- a legal document addressed to a General District CT. judge requesting a person be placed Involuntarily in a mental health facility.

#2 Detention order based upon the information provided in a mental petition by a General District judge will authorize a civil mental detention order.

II. Statutory Requirements / Considerations

1. VA Code Section 37.1.67

A. 1990 established authority for police officer to take mentally disturbed person into custody w/out a warrant or D.O.

G.O.'s non-arrest resolution of mental cases **will be** attempted whenever possible

B. Va. State Code: law enforcement Officer, who based upon observation or the reliable reports of others, has probable cause to believe that any person is mentally ill and in need of emergency evaluation for hospitalization may take that person into custody and transport them to an appropriate location to assess the need for hospitalization w/out prior judicial authorization. This is referred to as an Emergency Custody Detention. The subject can only be held four (4) hrs. If the subject has not been seen by a person skilled in the diagnosis and treatment of mental illness, within the 4 hr. period, you must respond to a Magistrate and obtain a Civil Mental Emergency Custody Order.

Subject should be taken to either Woodburn, Northwest or Mt. Vernon depending on area Ofc. is in. Subject can only be detained for a period not to exceed 4 hours. (T.O.)= 4.12.2.1

C. Mentally ill persons may be arrested for the commission of a specific offense.

2. Involuntary Admissions

If an emergency exists: if there a danger to themselves or others.

A. A trained person skilled in the diagnosis and treatment of mental illness through Fairfax County must evaluate the subject to determine if hospitalization is needed.

B. Magistrate at Mt. Vernon and ADC may issue a mental D.O. After normal court hours.

C. Officers refrain from initiating involuntary admissions as a petitioner unless there's no relative or responsible persons available to be the petitioner, unless the person appears to be danger to himself or others. (T.Q.)

D. Persons in need of medical attention Should be taken to the Emergency Room for treatment independent of the Mental Disorder. Prior to Mental Hospital T.Q.

(Police officers are required to fill out the execution block on the lower left hand corner of the order. The mental detention order is not valid until this is done. The Hospital or institution can refuse to accept patients, if the detention order is not properly executed.)

B. Persons served for detention at No. Va. Mental Health between 1700 and 0800 should be transported to Woodburn Center for Community Health for physical examination by a physician. The officer must remain until the completion of the exam and then transport the individual to the detention facility. (Also weekends holidays) (T.Q)

C. ***Mobile Crisis Unit.***

The Woodburn Center operates a Mobile Crisis Unit during the hours of 1500-2400 seven days a week. The unit is comprised of mental health professionals who operate out of the Emergency services Section of the Woodburn Center.

A team consisting of two persons will be working during the stated hours. The unit responds on a 24-hour basis under special circumstances such as a hostage/barricade situation.

- a. To respond to calls from Judges, Special Justices and Special Magistrates for the purpose of evaluating persons to determine whether detention is warranted, or in effecting feasible alternatives to involuntary detention.
- b. To respond to Police Department and Fire and Rescue Department requests for assistance in cases involving mental health problems where counseling is of potential benefit. Assistance may be provided by telephone consultation or by response to the scene where appropriate.

D. Northern VA. Mental Health is the public in-patient facility in Northern Virginia.

- F. **Excessive Force:** Any force which is not reasonably necessary.
- G. **Imminent Jeopardy:** When a subject has the intent, ability, means, and opportunity to inflict serious bodily injury or death.
- H. **Preclusion:** All other efforts will or have failed.
- I. **Institutional Integrity:** The condition whereby order is maintained in a detention facility to prevent violations of law, threatened assaults to others, attempted/threatened suicide, or failure of prisoners to respond to lawful commands to do any acts which are necessary for safety concerns of the facility.

III. *Case Law*

- A. Johnson v. Glick
 - 1. Established four points in determining whether Constitutional line has been crossed when utilizing deadly force.
 - a. Was there a need for the force?
 - b. The relationship between the need and the amount of force.
 - c. The extent of the injuries inflicted.
 - d. Whether the force was applied in good faith, or maliciously and sadistically for the very purpose of causing harm.

Wheelchair example

1973 – U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit: Johnson into House of Detention. Failed to follow directions. Officer Fuller went into cell and struck Johnson. Put Johnson in holding cell for two hours. Johnson was refused medical treatment for two hours. Johnson suffering from terrible pains in the head since.
RULING: Need for intentional force in correctional setting. Must use four- point test when reviewing.

B. Graham v. Connor (*Objective Reasonableness Standard*)

1. The court accepted the first three points of Johnson v. Glick, it rejected the last point dealing with the officers state of mind.
2. "Reasonableness" of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, and it's calculus must embody an allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force necessary in a particular situation.
3. The use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with the 20/20 vision of hindsight
4. Officer's underlying intent or motivation will not be a factor in determining whether the force used was reasonable.
 - a. Officer's evil intentions not factor with a reasonable use of force.
 - b. Officer's good intentions not a factor with an excessive use of force.

C. Tennessee v. Garner (*Fleeing Felon Rule*)

1. The use of deadly force to prevent the escape of all felony suspects, whatever the circumstances, is constitutionally unreasonable.

Graham was a diabetic. Connor stopped. Graham became combative. Connor arrested after using force.

2. Where the suspect poses not threat to the officer and no threat to others, the harm resulting from failing to apprehend does not justify to the use of deadly force to do so.
3. A police officer may not seize an unarmed, non-dangerous suspect by shooting him dead.
4. Police officers may use deadly force to apprehend a fleeing felon if he/she has probable cause to believe that the suspect poses a threat or serious physical injury or death, either to the officer or to others.
5. An officer must give a verbal warning when practical or feasible.

IV. General Orders

- A. Deadly force shall not be used unless it is reasonably necessary.
- B. Deadly force may be used to apprehend fleeing felons.
 1. All other means of arrest have been exhausted.
 2. Officer believes that the escape of the felon poses an imminent threat of death or serious physical injury to an officer(s) or other person(s).
- C. Deadly force cannot be used to apprehend a fleeing misdemeanor.

B. Verbal Commands

1. An officer should establish a command presence by the use of firm, professional commands.
2. The commands should be simple, easy to understand and repeated as necessary.
3. Verbal commands should be issued by *one officer* to avoid confusion.
4. If you notice that the primary officer is not issuing effective commands or has forgotten certain commands, tell that officer that they forgot a command or that you are going to give a command.

C. Empty Hand Control

1. Officers need to verbalize commands to a subject while attempting any empty hand control. You need to let the individual know what you want them to do.
2. Examples of empty hand control would be:
 - a. Escort Positions
 - b. Pressure Points

D. Artificial Incapacitators

1. These may be used in situations where empty hand controls have either proven to be ineffective or would not be prudent due to the subject's behavior.

F. Impact Weapons

1. Batons or other types of impact weapons can be used with varying degrees of intensity.
2. Batons may be used to strike the subject in designated target areas of the body such as:

E. Other factors that will be taken into consideration are:

1. Timeliness

- a. The officer must act to control the aggressive act in a timely manner. Force must not be used too early or too late relative to the subject's actions.
- b. Timeliness is defined as "not too early or too late to prevent physical injury, or to complete the legally authorized task".
- c. Factors that an officer must consider are:
 1. Distance
 2. Shielding
 3. Obstructions
 4. Type of Attack or Resistance Encountered
 5. Risk to others

Increased distance from subject allows more time to react.

Long Gun Disarm/Retention:

- **Retention** - Two options are discussed. The first is to move or zone to the outside of the opponent and deliver strikes to vulnerable areas. The second option is to "**Break the Stick**" by wrapping arm around the middle of the weapon and placing the other hand on one end of the weapon and violently thrusting away from opponent.
- The other option we discuss, when asked by recruits what to do if they are close to losing the grip on the weapon, is much more combative and aggressive in nature. It requires the officer to violently thrust the weapon to the floor and immediately begin to deliver powerful strikes to vulnerable areas then quickly disengaging and drawing their side arm as they seek cover or an escape.
- **Disarm** - Requires the weapon to be redirected and the officer to immediately "ride" the weapon, wrapping his arm closest arm around the middle of the weapon. The barrel of the weapon should be behind the officer and the weapon under his armpit. The officer then deploys strikes to vulnerable areas until the assailant releases the weapon.

Roles

Training Safety Officer (T.S.O.)

Has overall control of the training. He/she has the final say, and there is no questioning his/her authority. The safety officer is the only person who can start and stop the training cycle. The safety officer is responsible for the physical inspection of each of the role players prior to their entering into the training environment. He/she is also responsible for the final inspection of each of the trainees as they enter the training arena.

Officer in Charge (O.I.C.)

Responsible for the running of his/her scene. The OIC will take charge of the person being trained. He/she will conduct the initial safety inspection. From there the OIC will outfit the trainee with the required safety equipment. The OIC will brief the trainee about the scenario. After the briefing the OIC will direct the trainee to the TSO where he/she will get a final safety inspection. From there the trainee will be directed to the armorer where he/she will be issued their duty type weapon configured for Simunitions based training. The OIC will then run the scenario from beginning to the end. The OIC is the responsible for the de-brief, and the second attempt at the training scenario should it be required.

Weapons Officer (W.O.)

Responsible for the weapons table. He/she will take charge of the weapons at the start of the training day and inspect them for fit and function. The WO will be the only person allowed to handle the weapons outside the training environment. The WO will do all weapons cleaning and repair. At the end of the training cycle the trainee will report back to the WO where he/she will relinquish their weapon to the WO.

Flexible neck protection designed to be worn in tandem with the full-face helmet. Only approved neck protection will be worn. Both the neck and face protection will be worn at all times when in the training area.

Groin Protection.

Groin protection will be worn at all time when undergoing Simunitions based training. Standard forms of protection include hard cups designed to be worn inside the clothing, and hard rubber cups designed to be worn outside the clothing. While these are the recommended forms of protection, padding the groin area with some form of padding will be allowed.

Additional Protection.

Long pants, long sleeve shirts, boots, and gloves are suggested for training. The Simunitions training rounds are designed not to break exposed skin, however they can leave welts and blood blisters. Any additional protection on bare skin is suggested.

4. Quickly enter and pass through the fatal funnel
5. Move from point to point using shielding
6. Communicate with hand gestures
7. Use flashlight accordingly
8. If located; confront role players from shielding
9. Use proper commands to take into custody.
10. Locate both role players

Training Safety Officer (T.S.O.)

Has overall control of the training. He/she has the final say, and there is no questioning his/her authority. The safety officer is the only person who can start and stop the training cycle. The safety officer is responsible for the physical inspection of each of the role players prior to their entering into the training environment. He/she is also responsible for the final inspection of each of the trainees as they enter the training arena.

Officer in Charge (O.I.C.)

Responsible for the running of his/her scene. The OIC will take charge of the person being trained. He/she will conduct the initial safety inspection. From there the OIC will outfit the trainee with the required safety equipment. The OIC will brief the trainee about the scenario. After the briefing the OIC will direct the trainee to the TSO where he/she will get a final safety inspection. From there the trainee will be directed to the armorer where he/she will be issued their duty type weapon configured for Simunitions based training. The OIC will then run the scenario from beginning to the end. The OIC is the responsible for the de-brief, and the second attempt at the training scenario should it be required.

Weapons Officer (W.O.)

Responsible for the weapons table. He/she will take charge of the weapons at the start of the training day and inspect them for fit and function. The WO will be the only person allowed to handle the weapons outside the training environment. The WO will do all weapons cleaning and repair. At the end of the training cycle the trainee will report back to the WO where he/she will relinquish their weapon to the WO.
